# JEAN-BAPTISTE-DONATIEN DE VIMEUR DE ROCHAMBEAU JULY 1. 1725



**R**ochambeau is descended from a long line of soldiers who passed on to him the characteristics of leadership. In his early military campaigns, his commanders saw in the young Rochambeau as a man who could react quickly in the face of danger, put aside fear, and make sound decisions.

At 55 years old, he was a seasoned officer and had taken part in numerous sieges over his 37 years in service to his country. He was selected to lead the nearly 5,000 troops to aid the American cause for freedom from the British. His Majesty, King Louis XVI entrusted Rochambeau and his troops, in all cases, be under the command of General Washington. On March 2, 1780 he and the French fleet set sail for America.

In August, 1781 the intention to attack the British in Manhattan was scuttled and the combined armies set off to Yorktown, VA to attack the British. A quick crossing through New Jersey, ahead of the British realizing the true target and make them believe that Manhattan was still in the crosshairs, included splitting the armies into 3 columns and building massive bread ovens in Chatham as a ruse de guerre. The columns converged near Princeton, marched to Trenton crossed the Delaware River and headed to Yorktown, VA.

*I*n October, 1781 a siege of Yorktown, VA trapped the British. After 3 weeks, British General Lord Charles Cornwallis capitulated and surrendered in the final battle of the Revolutionary War.

**R**ochambeau returned to France in 1783. He and Washington continued their correspondence. He escaped the guillotine in the French Revolution and lived to be 81 years old. Rochambeau's chateau in France is still owned by his descendants and is open for tours.
